THE ADMISSION PROCESS

Lydia Urban Academy enrolls students four times a year at the beginning of each grading period (quarter). Openings are filled on a first come, first served basis with enrollment limited to ten students per classroom.

Students are accepted based on their need for a small, structured, learning environment. Student must be willing to: put forth the necessary effort for their personal success and discontinue any involvement in activities that cause barriers to success (i.e. use of illegal drugs, gang activity and violent behavior).

- O Health records completed by a physician (including proof of immunization)
- o LUA placement testing (reading and math)

- 2. Guide students to identify habits and patterns in their life that will enhance their future through the provision of student services and positive activities including counseling, mentoring, and faculty advocacy.

- 4. Demonstrate the love of Jesus Christ to all of our students through word and action.



FINANCIAL POLICY

Lydia is a nonprofit (501c-3) ministry providing quality education enabling students to become productive citizens within their community. Lydia Urban Academy believes that financial responsibility is a valid part of a student's education and preparation for the future. Therefore both students and parents are responsible to contribute financially.

The following is the Financial Policy of LYDIA Urban Academy:

- 1. Enrollment Fees:
 - a. There is a one-time registration fee of \$150 at enrollment. Registration and enrollment are not secured until this fee is paid.
 - b. All previous tuition and fees must be paid to begin a new school year.
- 2. Tuition and Fees total \$3,960 per year with financial assistance available:
 - a. STUDENT'S WORK STUDY: \$1,150 per year may be paid by participating in the Work Study tuition program. The choice is documented on the **Student Work Study Fee Agreement.**
 - If the student does not complete their Work Study agreement, the student's parent will be responsible for payment of the student's work study tuition balance. Fees will be added to the monthly tuition statement.
 - b. TUITION ASSISTANCE:
 - Generous scholarships are available based on financial need. Documentation of *total household income* is required in order to qualify for the *sliding fee scale*. "Sliding Fee Scale Application" must be completed and documented.
- 3. Tuition and fees must be current in order for the student to begin classes the next quarter.
- 4. School records will <u>not</u> be released until all tuition and fees are paid in full.
- 5. Diplomas will not be awarded until all tuition and fees are paid in full.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT AGREEMENT: student must initial in front of each standard

LYDIA Urban Academy (LUA) is a non-traditional Christian high school dedicated to providing a quality education in a positive environment that encourages academic excellence, high moral standards and personal discipline. The following standards of conduct define beliefs, and values that the school deems essential to the fulfillment of its mission. They are based on dignity of everyone, consideration of others, patience, empowerment of the 'oppressed', conflict avoidance, and reconciliation. Each student needs to read, agree to, and apply its contents. LYDIA will not enroll the student if there is no signed agreement on file.

- 1. I understand that if I cause a problem I will be asked to fix it. If I can't find a solution, a staff person will find a solution.
- 2. I will **show respect to my fellow students** by not engaging in racism, harassment, bullying, fighting, gossiping, or excluding people for activities or conversations; refrain from open displays of affection and sexual language/innuendoes at school or school events; and not engage in any violent behavior, nor bring any weapon, firearm, or illegal drugs to school.
 - 3. I will **show respect to the staff** by non-hostile (word or action) obedience to their directions and requests.
- 4. I will sincerely attempt to change my language habits and reduce my profanity to be professional. I understand that if I swear the staff will exhort me to use better language. I realize that I am subject to disciplinary action if I curse at staff or fellow student or continually exhibit profanity.
- 5. I appreciate the organization that occupies the building and grounds in which I attend. I will **not damage** this property or grounds in any way. I understand that I am subject to disciplinary action and payment for damages if I do so.
 - 6. I realize that LUA has a zero tolerance for drugs and alcohol. I agree not to use any drugs or alcohol (or speak publically) before school, during school hours, at lunch, or at any other school events. I understand that if I do, I will be subject to immediate discipline. I also understand that the staff may conduct random drug tests and school policy will be followed.
 - 7. I realize that consistent attendance is necessary for academic success; I will consistently attend school and arrive on time and do the school-work as assigned by my teachers. I understand that four unexcused absences in a class result in a failing quarter grade; that being tardy more than 10 minutes to class is equal to an unexcused absence; and being tardy to class less that 10 minutes for three times equal an excused absence.
- 8.1 will dress professionally appropriate ('business casual'). The attire will be modest and appropriately cover the body with no undergarments, bare midriffs, no thin shoulder straps or cleavage showing. Pants will be worn above the hips with no undergarments showing. No hats or hoods. No gang related, sexual, profane, or alcohol/drug related clothing or jewelry to school or school events. I will yield to the faculty decisions as to the appropriateness.
